The importance of strong teacher subject knowledge is key and teachers understand that in geography this is not static, but always developing.


Tasks are carefully set so that children are always thinking about the geographical learning.

All learning journeys begin with a 'What is Geography?' session so that pupils understand what it means to be a geographer.

A range of trips are planned meaningfully to enhance pupils' geographical learning.

Trips and field study support geographical learning and develop skills to navigate and engage with the world. There are strong learning outcomes following field study.



Classroom environments

promote geography learning and geographical thinking. Classrooms all have globes, maps and atlases on display at all times.

Learners complete Pop Quizzes regularly to ensure their key knowledge is recalled and embedded in the long term memory.

Early Morning Learning gives learners and opportunity to revisit knowledge taught in previous year groups. All our Effective Principals of
